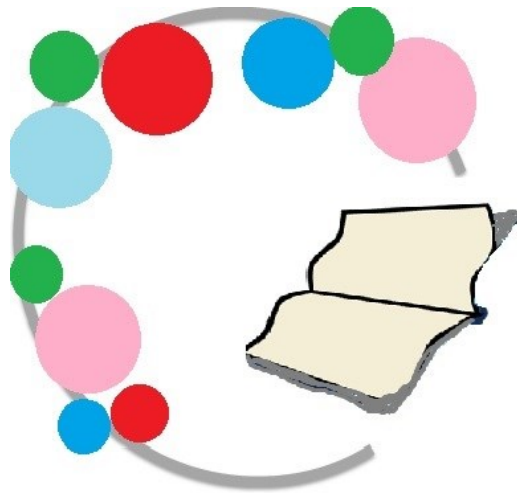
This innovative, interactive and collaborative workshop will take place over three sessions. Each session will explore different literacy themes.
